Understanding DOTP & DINP Gloves

ENACTED IN 1986, PROP 65 IS A CALIFORNIA LAW

intended to reduce or eliminate exposure to certain substances. It is comprised of a list of substances that the State of California recognizes as causing cancer and/or birth defects

The addition of DINP to the Prop 65 list of banned chemicals is forcing glove manufacturers to re-formulate to **A NEW, NON-BANNED PLASTICIZER CALLED DOTP**

DINP (Disononyl phthalate) is a plasticizer used in the manufacture of **MANY VINYL** (polyvinyl chloride/PVC) **PRODUCTS**, including electrical wire, coated fabrics, automotive parts, vinyl flooring, & footwear, as well as general purpose & medical examination **GLOVES**

PROP 65 LABEL WARNING As of August 2018

Clear & reasonable label warning requirements include approved "short form" & "long form" versions.
